



## GSE Honors Algebra II A – Fall 2020

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**Course Description and Instructional Goals:** This course is designed to provide students the opportunity to learn and be able to do the mathematics designated for GSE Algebra II. Curriculum, instruction, and assessment will enable students explore the following topics this semester:

- Unit 1: Quadratics Revisited
- Unit 2: Operations with Polynomials
- Unit 3: Polynomial Functions
- Unit 4: Rational Relationships

**Supplies:** Each student should keep a math notebook. A 3-ring binder with lined paper, as well as graphing paper is required. The organization of the notebook will be discussed in class. Students also will need writing utensils, specifically #2 pencils.

**Calculator:** Two types of calculators will be used in this course; graphing and non-graphing. Our teachers at Pope are most comfortable with the TI-83, or TI-84+ family graphing calculators and the TI-30 or TI-34 Multiview. Each student is required to at have a graphing calculator. Please email your teacher if that may be an issue for you.

**Grading Policy:** There will be no retake tests if you perform poorly on a test. You must do well on the tests to do well in the class. The grade distribution for this semester will be as follows:

- 55% Tests
- 20% Quizzes
- 5% Homework/Classwork
- 20% Fall Final

**Make Up Work:** In the event of a student absence, it is the student's responsibility to acquire missing assignments from the blog and get the notes from a classmate. It is the student's responsibility to learn the material missed during the absence.
